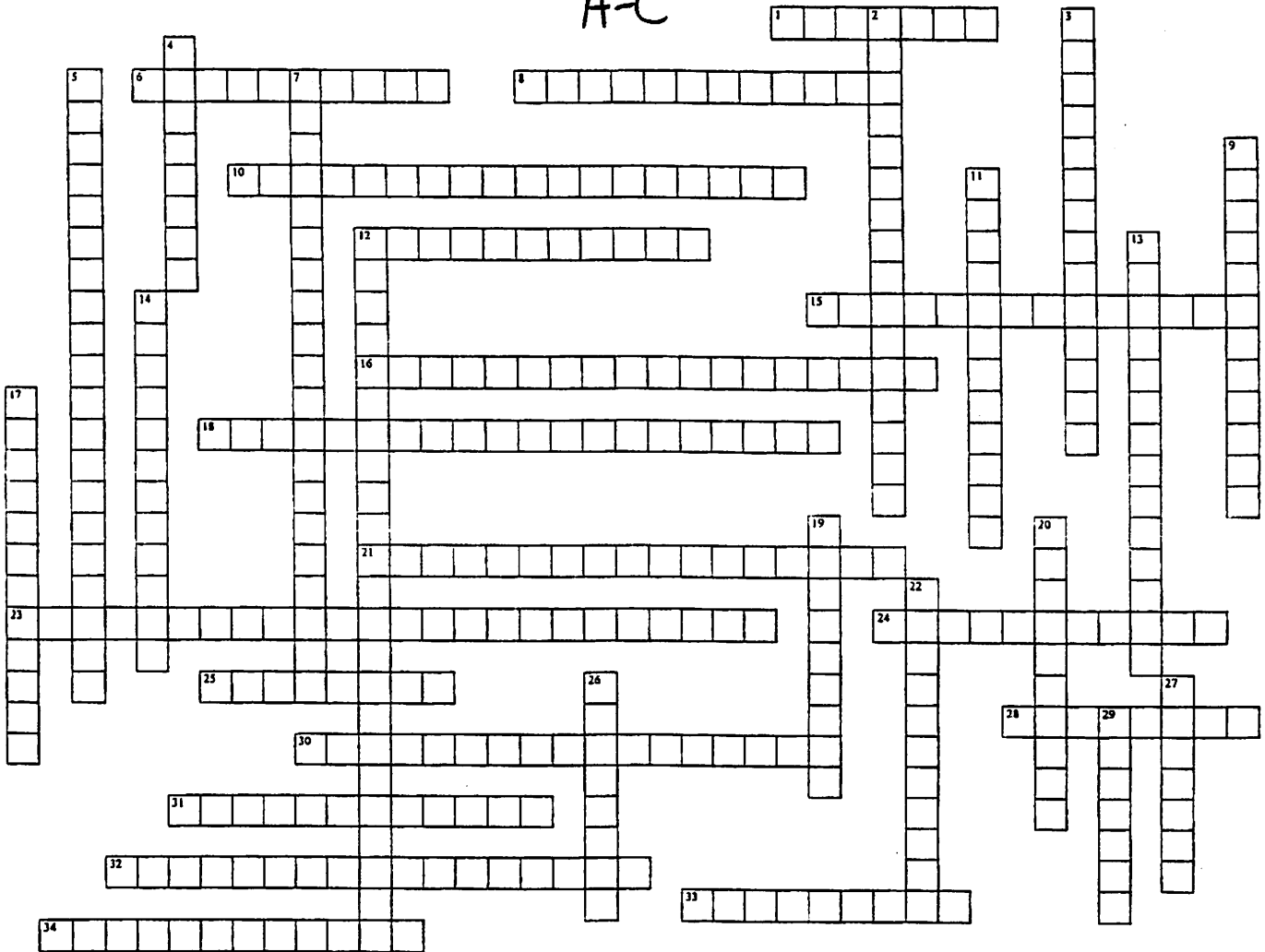

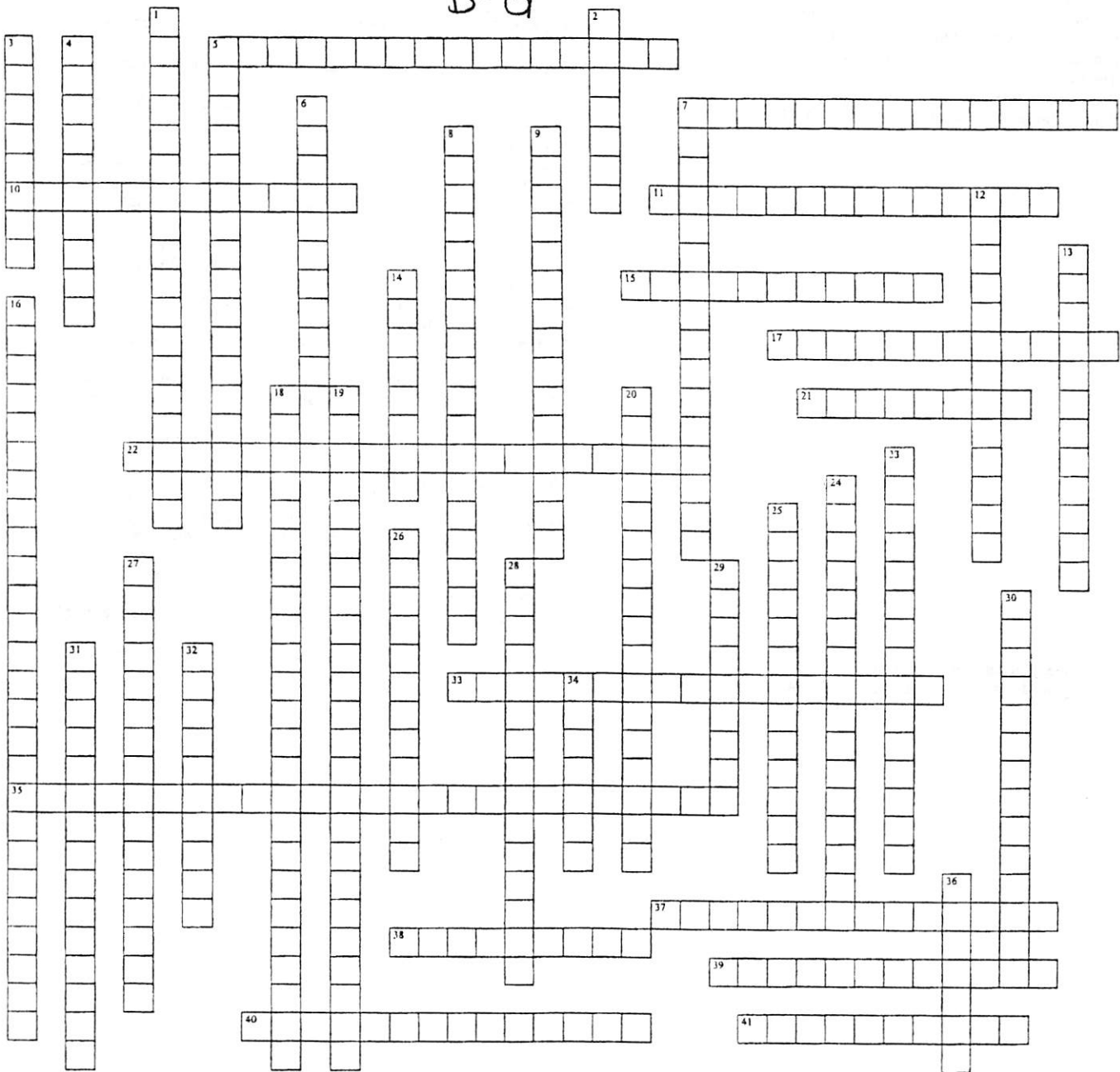

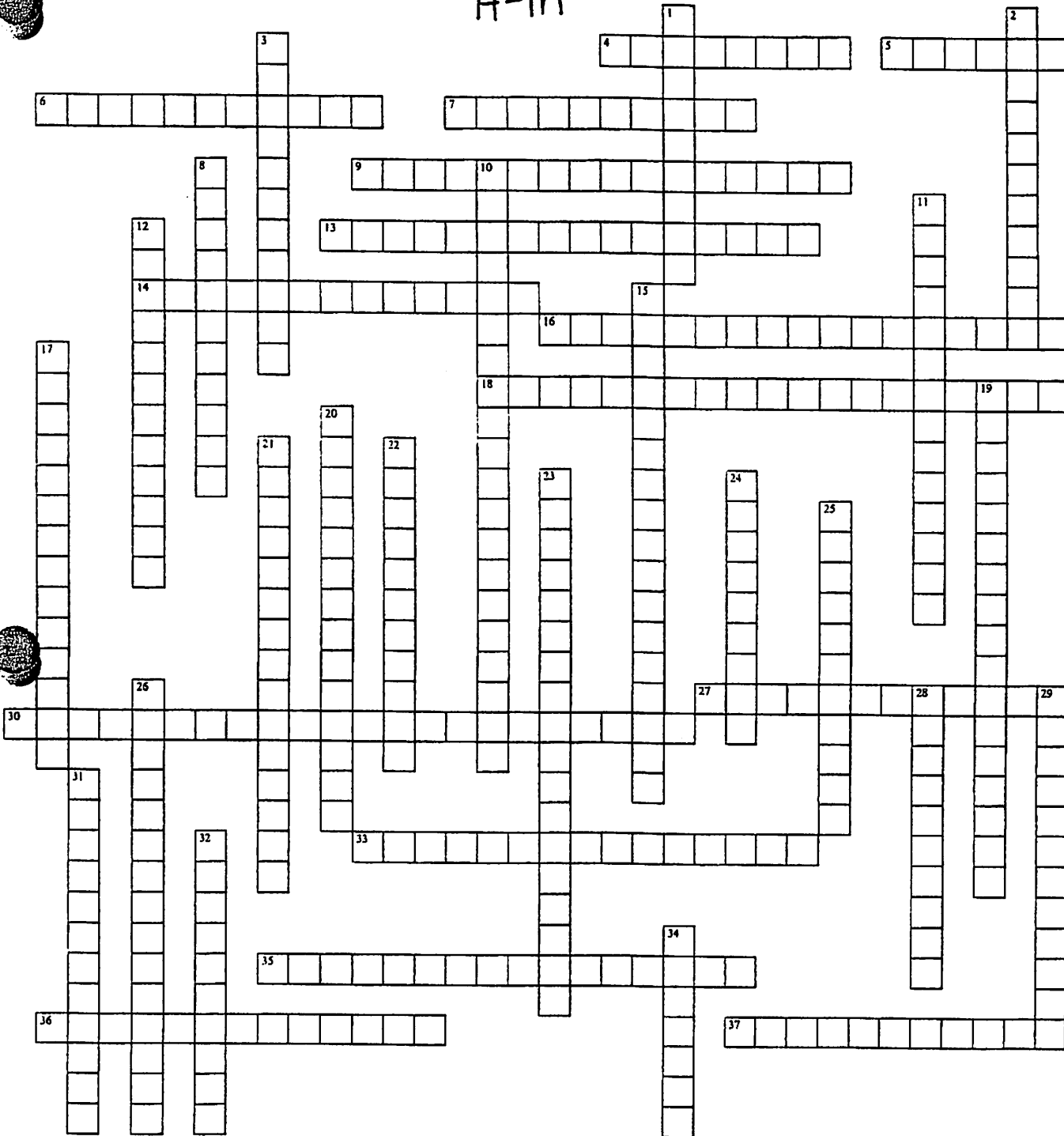

- 39 The name given to LBJ's domestic program in the 1960s
- 40 President Wilson's proposal in 1918 for a postwar European peace
- 41 A long and severe decline in economic activity
- 12 Eighteenth-century movement that emphasized science and reason as the key to improving society
- 13 A person who organizes, operates, and assumes the risks of a business enterprise
- 14 A period of political "openness" in the Soviet bloc brought about by Mikhail Gorbachev
- 16 A right guaranteed to American citizens under the Fourteenth Amendment
- 18 The Presidential decree of 1863 that freed slaves in Confederate-held territory
- 19 System put into practice under the Seventeenth Amendment whereby the voters rather than the state legislatures elect members of the US Senate
- 20 Famous speech by President Lincoln on the meaning of the Civil War
- 23 Constitutional guarantee that government will not deprive any person of life, liberty, or property by any unfair, arbitrary, or unreasonable action
- 24 An assembly elected by the voters that meets every four years to formally elect the President
- 25 Part of the Constitution which is the basis for the implied powers of Congress
- 26 Desire to enlarge the territory owned or controlled by one's nation
- 27 Fighting by stealth and with small bands, which make surprise attacks against stronger forces
- 28 President Taft's policy of encouraging United States investment in Latin America
- 29 Term used to describe the period from 1865 to 1900
- 30 One who believed that that Bible is the literal word of God
- 31 The plan for a two-house legislature adopted at the Constitutional Convention in 1787 that settled differences between large and small states over representation in Congress

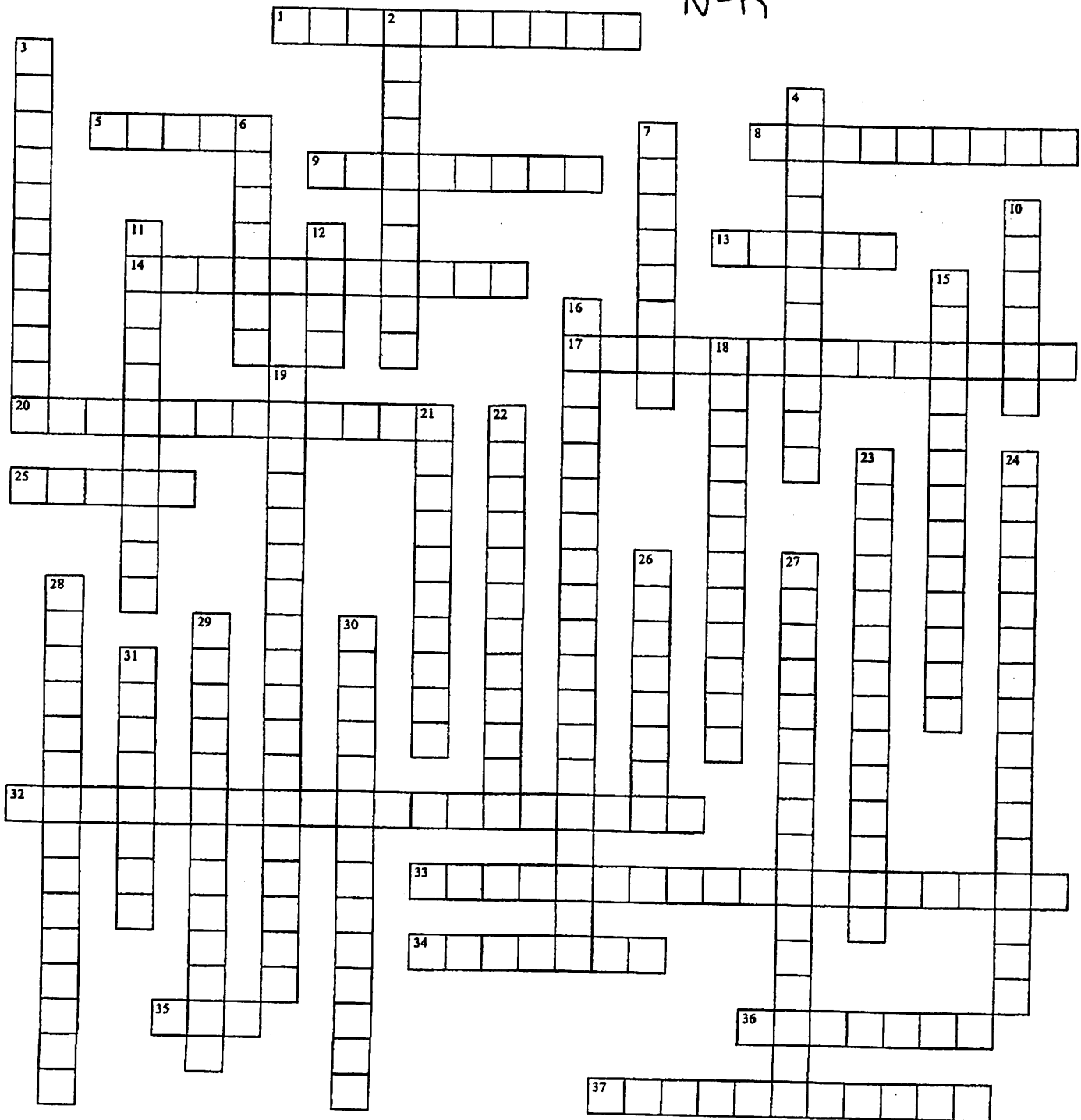

  - 27 Economic theory that a nation's strength came from building up its gold supplies and expanding its trade
  - 30 Lower house of the US Congress in which states are represented according to the size of their populations
  - 33 Places of confinement during wartime
  - 35 Agreement signed by Pilgrims before landing at Plymouth
  - 36 Policy under President Andrew Jackson of moving all Native Americans to lands west of the Mississippi River
  - 37 The imaginary line between Soviet-dominated Eastern Europe and the West
- opponents portrayed as subversive
  - 10 Roads, bridges, canals, and other similar projects funded by the national government
  - 11 Power of the Supreme Court to determine the constitutionality of laws
  - 12 1862 law that offered 160 acres of western land to settlers
  - 15 Belief that government is not all-powerful, and may only do the things the people have given it the power to do
  - 17 Rapid manufacture of large numbers of product
  - 19 Process by which a nation begins to develop industry
  - 20 Policy statement of President Monroe in 1823 warning nations of western Europe not to interfere with the newly independent nations of Latin America
  - 21 A belief held in the first half of the nineteenth century that the United States had a mission to expand its borders to incorporate all land between the Atlantic and Pacific Oceans
  - 22 Policy by which one country takes control of another either directly or through economic or political dominance
  - 23 Trade between the states
  - 24 Early twentieth-century American journalist who tried to improve society by exposing political corruption, health hazards, and other social problems
  - 25 The movement of people from other countries into a country
  - 26 Association of nations to protect the independence of member nations, proposed by President Wilson in his Fourteen Points and formed after World War I
  - 28 A court order prohibiting a given action
  - 29 A call-up of military forces, usually in preparation for war
  - 31 A policy of avoiding alliances and other types of involvement in foreign affairs of other nations
  - 32 Workers organized as a group to seek higher wages, improve working conditions, and obtain benefits
  - 34 Faire/noninterference; has come to mean a policy by which the government minimizes its regulation of industry and the economy

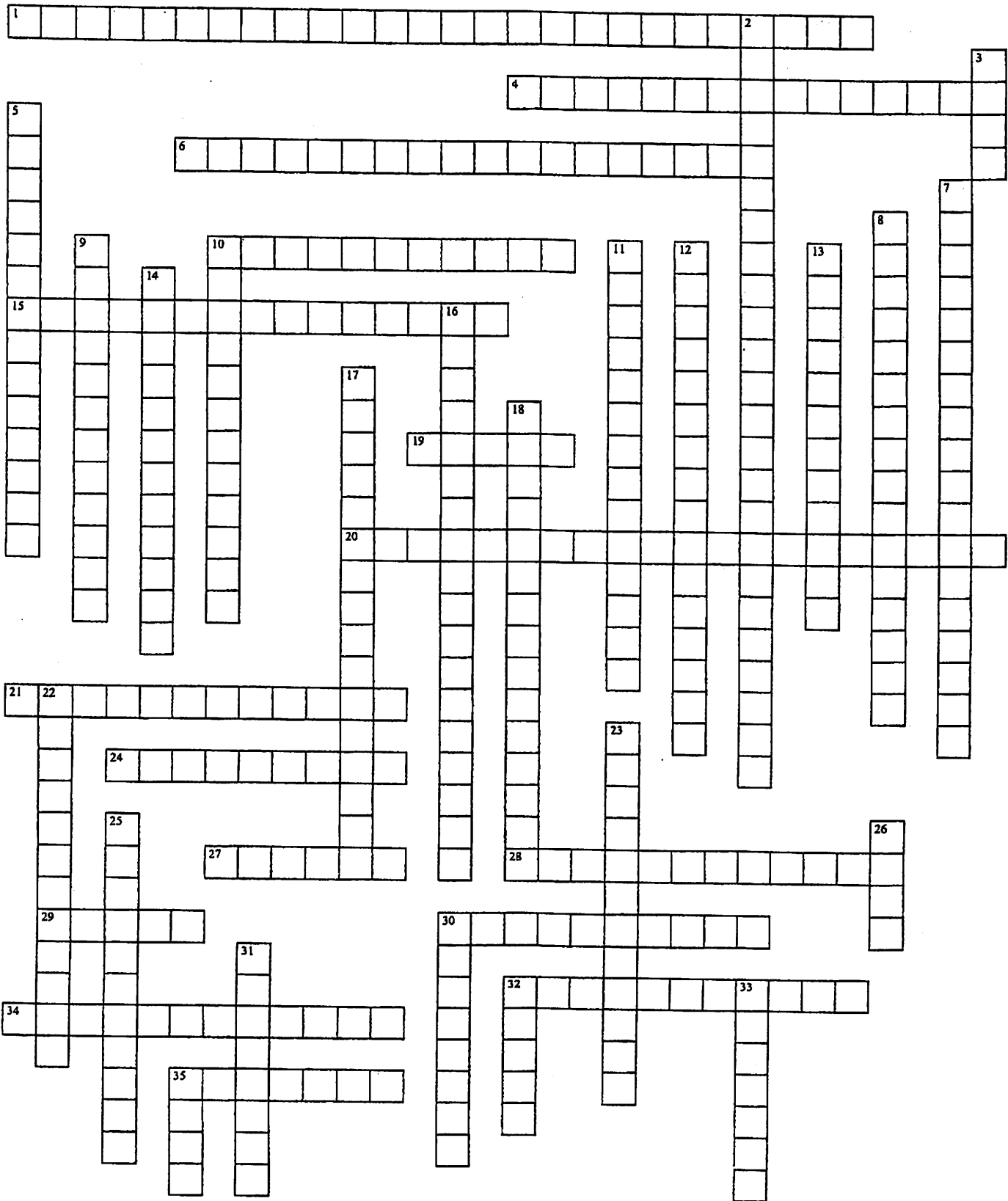

- 16 The principle that gives the powers of making, enforcing, and interpreting laws to separate legislative, executive, and judicial branches of government

- 18 Manner in which England governed the American colonies in the late 1600s and early 1700s, marked by weak enforcement of laws regulating colonial life
- 22 The forced movement of Cherokee in 1838 to 1839 to land west of the Mississippi River
- 23 Law passed in 1973 requiring the President to seek congressional approval if troops are sent into action for longer than 60 days
- 25 Separation of people of different races
- 26 Chief executive's power to reject a bill passed by a legislature
- 30 The right to vote
- 31 White Southerner who supported Radical Republicans during Reconstruction
- 32 Group of corporations run by a single board of directors
- 33 Smaller towns surrounding large cities
- 35 Determination/right of national groups to their own territories and their own forms of government
